CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. All exhibits, other than flowers arranged for effect i.e. floral art classes, must be grown by the exhibitor.
- 2. Allocation of prizes will only be made to those entries deemed worthy of a prize by the Judge. The Judge's decision shall be deemed final.
- 3. If an exhibit has been placed in the wrong class, the Judge may direct the Steward to place the exhibit in the correct class and re-judge that class.
- 4. GST implications are as those listed in the front of the Schedule.

DEFINITIONS

- 1. **Bowl** is defined as a circular or oval vessel whose smallest diameter measures across the top more than the height.
- 2. A **trough** is defined as a "narrow receptacle whose length is greater than the width".
- 3. A **collection** is judged on quality, freshness and variety, not quantity of any variety.
- 4. A **container** is defined as any vessel that can be used for an arrangement.
- 5. **Distinct** means each bloom must be different.
- 6. Exhibitors, where possible, to exhibit cut flowers in **green** bottles particularly Dahlias and Roses. Not painted bottles. Green wine bottles are suitable.

- Accessories including bases, drapes, containers, title cards & mechanics are permitted with any arrangement.
- All arrangements must have natural plant material predominating and NO SOIL.
- All fresh plant material should be staged with cut ends in water or water retaining material (e.g. florist foam), unless the plant material will remain in a satisfactory condition for the length of the show.
- Due to the current space constraints, all floral arrangements to be no more than 50cm wide and 35cm deep when staged.
- H109 *"Free Expression"* A creative masterpiece with no restrictions but no more than 50cm wide and 35cm deep when staged. Surprise us by showing your imagination, creativity and artistic ability!
- H110 "Australiana" An entirely
 Australian native flora and or foliage
 arrangement.
- H111 "Out of the Box" An arrangement using a box but think outside the square.
- H112 *"Pink Rules"* An arrangement using only pink flowers self or additional foliage permitted.
- H113 *"Roses are Red"* A romantic table arrangement using red roses only rose foliage permitted.
