<b>JUDGING</b>	Judging will commence from 9:00am onwards on Thursday 30/01/2025.
<b>PRIZE MONEY and/or PRIZES</b>	There will be place ribbons and championship trophies as stated in Classes.
<b>COLLECTION OF ENTRIES</b>	Exhibits can be collected on Saturday 01/02/2025 from 2pm onwards, and must be collected before 4pm.

# CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

---

1. Judges will be appointed by the National Council of Wool Selling Brokers of Australia Ltd, Queensland Branch.
2. All fleeces to be shorn during the past 12 months from sheep which are the bona fide property of the exhibitor for that period. All fleeces to be skirted.
3. All fleeces will be micron tested prior to judging. The primary classifications will be:
  - ULTRAFINE –15.5u and finer.
  - SUPERFINE - 15.6u to 17.0u.
  - FINE - 17.1u to 18.5u.
  - MEDIUM/ STRONG - 18.6u and broader.
4. The Judge shall have the power to alter classes if considered necessary.
5. Exhibitors eligible to compete in restricted classes 1- 10 must, in the opinion of the stewards, be considered local producers.
6. Fleeces which in the opinion of the judge are considered to be overgrown will be judged accordingly.
7. If in the opinion of the Judge a fleece is not made up of wool from the one sheep, all fleeces from that exhibitor will be disqualified.
8. In Flock classes, fleeces to be selected during annual shearing from sheep neither selected nor separately managed prior to shearing muster. Fleeces from sheep not so handled will be placed in the Stud classes.
9. Trophies will be on display in the Sheep and Wool Pavilion during the Show.
10. Stewards reserve the right to alter the prizes in any or all classes. Prizes from sponsors cannot be guaranteed. Prizes will not be awarded if there are less than two entries in the class.
11. No bale twine or other fibrillating fibre allowed in the Sheep and Wool Pavilion.
12. Coated wool is ineligible for restricted classes 1- 9.
13. The judge will be available on Thursday to give comments and discuss the Wool Show with exhibitors, who are welcome to observe the judging.

## RESTRICTED CLASSES - FLOCK SHEEP BREEDERS' CLASSES

All fleeces must be from sheep bred by the exhibitor.

**D1 Fleece merino** (hoggets, ewe or wether) - any micron.

### CLASS D1: BEST HOGGET FLEECE

Winner receives a trophy donated by **Granite Belt Property Management**.

**D2 Fleece merino** (ewe) - any micron

**D3 Fleece merino** (wether) - any micron

### Classes D1-D3: CHAMPION DISTRICT FLEECE

bred by Competitor.

Winner is eligible for the **M.D. Ferrier Memorial Trophy**.

## OPEN RESTRICTED CLASSES

**D4 Fleece ultrafine** (ewe or wether)

**D5 Fleece superfine** (ewe or wether)

### Classes D4 – D5: BEST FLEECE

Winner receives a trophy donated by **Australian Wool Network**.

**D6 Fleece fine** (ewe or wether)  
Winner receives a trophy donated by **S M Finlay**.

**D7 Fleece medium/strong** (ewe or wether)

**D8 Fleece coated** (any micron - ewe or wether)
